

"From that time Jesus began to preach, saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

A Letter from Father Joe:



Dear faithful & friends of Ypapanti:

Over the years, my observation is that the majority of church members do not look forward to Great Lent; because they consider it a burden, an inconvenience and a disruption of the routines of life. Which is why so many choose to ignore Lent, or to only make the most minimal effort. This is very unfortunate, because Lent is intended to be beautiful, still, peaceful, instructive and therapeutic. Great Lent has has once again, begun in in the Orthodox Church. I've been thinking that every year we go through Lent, we reach Pascha (Easter), we have a joyous celebration, and then we go back to living again, as if we hadn't gone through Lent and Pascha at all.

So, what is the point of Great Lent? Is it just to impose some kind of special discipline, extra worship services, exclusive to this season, some extraordinary, unique, spiritual practices that we forget when it's over? Lent, however, really isn't just about that. Lent is about helping us understand how to develop and enhance a spiritual life that we can carry with us all year around. Lent is not just about dietary changes. It's not just about trying to fast like monks who live in a closed community, secluded from the outside world.

More importantly, Lent is about developing a sustaining spirituality, that has Lent as its seed; an inward-looking spirituality, where we start to care for the condition of our souls, as much as we care for the condition of our outward lives. A balanced life, is what Lent is supposed to be about. A balancing with the turning of our hearts, our minds and our souls, looking both inward and outward.

We have the Orthodox Lenten prayer of Saint Ephraim, the Syrian, which is really a beautiful prayer, one that we should meditate on throughout the entirety of Lent.

"Lord and Master of my life, take from me the spirit of sloth, despair, lust of power and idle talk.

But give rather to Your servant, the spirit of chastity, humility, patience and Love.

Yes, Lord and King, grant that I may see my own sins, and not to judge my brother (or sister); for You are Blessed unto ages of ages. Amen."

There is also another prayer that is beneficial to meditate on during Lent. It's from the great western church Father, Francis of Assisi. It sums up what Lent is about.

"Lord, make me an instrument of Your peace; where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, healing; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; and where there is sadness, joy."

"O Divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console; to be understood, as to understand; to be loved, as to love; for it is in giving that we receive, and it is in forgiveness that we are forgiven, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life."

Think about these prayers and meditate on them all of Lent. As we go forward on another Lenten journey, we must do so with humility, by granting forgiveness to those who have offended or hurt us. Letting go of grudges and asking forgiveness from those whom we have offended or hurt. By doing so, it opens the doors to the Kingdom of Heaven. Without forgiveness, we cannot enter that Kingdom.

We need to make our journey through Great Lent, both inwardly (through prayer, reading of scripture and the counsels of the church fathers and soul searching) and outwardly (through fasting, alms giving, increased church worship attendance and pious preparation for the holy sacraments). This is the Church's prescription to a blessed life and soul transforming Holy Pascha.

One verse from Forgiveness Sunday Vespers proclaims in hymnology, the whole meaning of Great Lent... " (Lord) Turn not your face away from Your servant; for I am in distress, I am afflicted. Hear me speedily and hearken to my soul and deliver it!"

May we make the most of this opportunity set before us. Forgive me for my offenses and pray for me a sinner!


